This study appears well-written and provides a clear outline of the research topic, methodology, and findings. But it would have been helpful.

1. To include more details on the specific research objectives and hypotheses tested in the study.
2. The paper should present a gap in the literature on the correlation between self-sacrificial leadership and knowledge-sharing and knowledge-hiding behavior, which the present study aims to fill. The introduction must also provide a clear overview of the research problem and the study's rationale.
3. The Literature review section presented seems to provide a comprehensive and critical review of the relevant literature related to the study's theoretical foundation. It is organized and structured well, with the introduction clearly indicating the theory underpinning the investigation. However, the section must proceed to discuss the key concepts and constructs related to the study, providing an in-depth analysis of the literature.

4. In the discussion section, the study must also present knowledge-hiding behavior among employees, which can be attributed to their lack of trust in their supervisors and company policies. The study should recommend that managers and supervisors develop unambiguous policies for the dissemination of knowledge and evaluate employees based on their performance in this regard.

Reviewer B

The study is based on Social-Exchange Theory, which investigates the relationship between self-sacrificial leadership and employees' knowledge-sharing and knowledge-hiding behaviors in small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) in Medan, Indonesia. The study finds a positive correlation between self-sacrificial leadership and knowledge-sharing behavior and a negative correlation with knowledge-hiding behavior. However,

1. The introduction must provide background on SMEs, their contributions to the economy, and their significant presence in Indonesia. It should also explain the concept of self-sacrificial leadership and its effects on various employee outcomes.
2. It is important to present in detail the way the paper contributes to the existing literature on the consequences of self-sacrificial leadership and proposes key policy insights, theoretical implications, practical implications, and future research directions.
3. The study should explain in detail how employees' trust and intrinsic motivation mediate the relationship between self-sacrificial leadership and knowledge-sharing and knowledge-hiding behaviors.
4. The section presents a comprehensive review of the data analysis and results of the study. The use of SmartPLS software for structural equation modeling is appropriate for the study's research questions. The authors must also report using ANOVA to assess the potential influence of participants' demographic characteristics on the dependent variable, which is a good practice.
